






Virginia Homelessness Trends 2010-2019




Total Homeless Persons

Virginia Housing Trust Fund

- FY 2019 Increase from \$5.5 million to \$11 million
- Increase in Homeless Reduction Grants Pool which is up to 20% of HTF - \$1.4 million
- Increase allowed 16 additional Homeless Reduction Grants funded and 7 additional affordable housing construction projects






Total Persons in Households w/ Adults and Children (Families)






Total Persons in Households without Children (singles)






Total Homeless Youth (18-24)






Total Unsheltered Persons






Veterans






Unsheltered Veterans






Chronically Homeless Singles






Chronic Substance Abuse
