## Professional Development for Child Care

Undergraduate college courses required for a certificate or degree in early childhood education may be approved for payment through the Virginia Child Care Provider Scholarship Program (VCCPSP), as funding allows. Child care teachers and directors are essential contributors to Virginia's workforce and economy, and we value their efforts to improve the quality of child care by increasing their knowledge and skills in early care and education.

## **Maximum Award Amount**

The Scholarship Program will pay for either eight college courses or a maximum lifetime award of **\$2,988**, whichever occurs first. The scholarship award pays the cost of tuition and technology fees for up to two courses per semester. Any additional fees for activities, parking, travel or expenses (such as books) are the responsibility of the student.

## **Eligibility Information**

The applicant must meet all of the following criteria (Regulation 22 VAC 40-690-30).

- 1. Be an employee of a child care program located in Virginia, OR a Virginia resident (as defined by the *Code of Virginia*) who is employed in a non-Virginia child care program, OR a Virginia resident who intends to become employed in child care.
- 2. Select a Program-approved course for which a scholarship was not previously received.
- 3. Have no more than one past occurrence of the following: (a) received an award and did not register for the class; (b) withdrew from the awarded class after the add/drop deadline (college's last day to receive a refund) and did not complete the course; or (c) received a failing grade for an awarded course. For any one-time occurrence of the noted conditions, the Department will not award future scholarships to an individual until the applicant reimburses the State for the course tuition and fees that were paid to the college or university on behalf of the applicant.
- 4. Priority will be given to applicants currently employed in the field of child care. Based on eligibility and funding availability, applications for applicants who do not currently work in child care will be processed in the final week before the application deadline.

## Payment 1 4 1

This program does not reimburse college students. The program directly pays the colleges. If an award letter is not received in time from the Program and the college requires payment from the student, it is the student's responsibility to ensure that the college policy allows reimbursement to the student if the student receives a scholarship later. The Program will notify the educational institutions' business offices of any VCCPSP awards.

## **Communication with Students**

Program **staff will only speak directly with scholarship applicants/recipients** about the status of their scholarship application unless dated, written permission is provided for another individual to speak on the student's behalf each semester.

## Changes in Your Plans Regarding the Scholarship

By the last day to add/drop (without financial penalty), students must complete and submit a Course Change Form to VCCPSP if: (1) the awarded course is no longer available and a substitute pre-approved course is requested, or (2) the scholarship cannot be used due to extenuating circumstances, or (3) an advisor recommends another course.
