### **IMPORTANT NOTICES**

1. Unless otherwise specified, all section ("§") references herein are to the Code of Virginia (1950, as amended).
2. SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR OTHER IDENTIFYING NUMBER: The social security number is solicited pursuant to § 18.2-308.2:2. If provided, the social security number will help prevent misidentification and will allow for a more thorough search of all state and federal computerized criminal history records. The social security number will not be made part of any public record. Pursuant to § 18.2-308.2:2, the State Police shall not maintain records longer than 30-days, except for multiple handgun transactions for which records shall be maintained for 12 months from the date of transaction, pertaining to any buyer or transferee who is not found to be prohibited from possessing or transporting a firearm under state or federal law. This information is provided pursuant to the Government Data Collection and Dissemination Practices Act (§2.2-3800, et seq). § 2.2-3800 (C) (10) provides that an agency shall not collect personal information except as explicitly or implicitly authorized by law. Pursuant to § 2.2-3803 (A), it is unlawful for an agency to require an individual to disclose or furnish his social security number for any purpose in connection with any activity, or to refuse any service, privilege or right to an individual wholly or partly because the individual does not disclose such number, unless the disclosure or furnishing of such number is specifically required by federal or state law. Disclosure of your social security number is not mandatory in the completion of this form. An example of an "other identifying number" is a home state driver's license number.
3. ORDERS OF PROTECTION AND SUBSTANTIAL RISK ORDERS: Pursuant to § 18.2-308.1:4 and 18.2-308.1:6, it shall be unlawful for any person who is subject to (i) a protective order entered pursuant to § 16.1-253.1, 16.1-253.4, 16.1-278.2, 16.1-279.1, 19.2-152.8, 19.2-152.9, or § 19.2-152.10; (ii) an order issued pursuant to subsection B of § 20-103; (iii) an order entered pursuant to subsection D of § 18.2-60.3; (iv) a preliminary protective order entered pursuant to subsection F of § 16.1-253 where a petition alleging abuse or neglect has been filed; (v) an emergency substantial risk order or a substantial risk order entered pursuant to §19.2-152.13 or 19.2-152.14; or (vi) an order issued by a tribunal of another state, the United States or any of its territories, possessions or commonwealths, or the District of Columbia pursuant to a statute that is substantially similar to those cited in clauses (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), or (v) to purchase or transport any firearm while the order is in effect. A violation of these sections is a Class 1 misdemeanor.
4. UFIN OR UPIN: A Unique Firearms Identification Number (UFIN) may be issued by the Virginia State Police upon successful appeal of a denied firearms purchase application, and may be used in future firearm purchase applications with Virginia firearms dealers, only. Or, a Unique Personal Identification Number (UPIN) may be issued by the FBI for nationwide use. In either instance, a complete criminal history record information check will continue to be performed at the time of purchase. A UFIN or UPIN will prompt the State Police Firearms Transaction Center to check the appropriate appeals file in the processing of your transaction.
5. SALE OF AN ASSAULT WEAPON: Pursuant to § 18.2-308.2:2, no dealer shall sell, rent, trade or transfer from his inventory any assault firearm to any person who is not a citizen of the United States or who is not a person lawfully admitted for permanent resident.

### **EXCEPTIONS**

A person who has been convicted of a felony is not prohibited from purchasing, receiving, or possessing a firearm if: (1) under the law where the conviction occurred, the person has been pardoned, this conviction has been expunged or set aside, or the person has had civil rights (the right to vote, sit on a jury and hold public office) restored **AND** (2) the person is not prohibited by the law where the conviction occurred from receiving or possessing firearms (**MUST HAVE BOTH 1 & 2**). Persons subject to this exception should answer "no" to question 7.

A person who, pursuant to § 18.2-308.1:1, 18.2-308.1:2, or 18.2-308.1:3, has had his firearms rights restored by a court after having been prohibited from purchasing, possessing, or transporting a firearm as a result of being (i) acquitted by reason of insanity; (ii) adjudicated legally incompetent, mentally incapacitated, or incapacitated; (iii) involuntarily admitted to a facility or ordered to mandatory outpatient treatment; or (iv) the subject of a temporary detention order and subsequently agreeing to voluntary admission should answer "no" to question 9.

It shall be unlawful for (i) any person who has been convicted of a felony; (ii) any person adjudicated delinquent, as a juvenile 14 years of age or older at the time of the offense of murder in violation of § 18.2-31 or 18.2-32, kidnapping in violation of § 18.2-47, robbery by the threat or presentation of firearms in violation of § 18.2-58, or rape in violation of § 18.2-61; or (iii) any person under the age of 29 who was adjudicated delinquent as a juvenile 14 years of age or older at the time of the offense of a delinquent act which would be a felony if committed by an adult, other than those felonies set forth in clause (ii), whether such conviction or adjudication occurred under the laws of the Commonwealth, or any other state, the District of Columbia, the United States or any territory thereof, to knowingly and intentionally possess or transport any firearm discharge and not otherwise prohibited.

Possession of firearms by persons adjudicated delinquent; military service exception. Pursuant to § 18.2-308.2, an individual who was adjudicated delinquent when 14 years of age or older of a delinquent act that would be a felony if committed by an adult and has completed a term of enlistment of no less than two years in the Armed Forces of the United States and, if such person has been discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States, received an honorable discharge, is not disqualified from purchasing a firearm. This exception does not apply to convictions of murder in violation of § 18.2-31 or 18.2-32, kidnapping in violation of § 18.2-47, robbery by the threat or presentation of firearms in violation of § 18.2-58, or rape in violation of § 18.2-61.

### **INSTRUCTIONS TO TRANSFEEE (BUYER)**

The buyer of a firearm will in every instance personally complete Section A of the form and certify (sign) that the answers are true and correct.

IF THE BUYER IS UNABLE TO READ AND/OR TO WRITE: The answers may be written by other persons excluding the seller of the firearm. Two persons (other than the seller or employees of the seller) will then sign as witnesses to the buyer's answers and signature. Two persons, other than the transferor, must then sign the form alongside the buyer's mark as witnesses to the transaction **AND TO AFFIRM THE PURCHASER'S IDENTITY**.

### **TRANSFEEE'S (BUYERS) RIGHTS**

The individual denied the purchase or pawn redemption of the firearm(s) who believes that he or she is not prohibited by state or federal law may pursue the matter as follows: (1) Contact the Firearms Transaction Center Help Desk at (804) 674-2292 or (804) 674-2788 to discuss the ineligible determination and/or to provide additional information deemed pertinent to the final determination of eligibility, or email [firearms@vsp.virginia.gov](mailto:firearms@vsp.virginia.gov). (2) Review their criminal history record and request correction of the record if the record is found to be in error, pursuant to § 9.1-132, provided that any such action is initiated within 30 days of the denial. (3) Exercise their right to institute a civil action pursuant to § 9.1-135, provided that any such action is initiated within 30 days of the denial. (4) Challenge to the accuracy of a record, in writing, to: FBI, NICS Operations Center, Criminal Justice Information Services Division, 1000 Custer Hollow Road, Module C-3, Clarksburg, West Virginia 26306-0147, or via the NICS Appeal Website at <http://www.fbi.gov/nics-appeals>. This process of appeal is authorized by 28 CFR 25.10.

### **INSTRUCTIONS TO TRANSFEROR (SELLER)**

EMPLOYEE/SELLER IDENTIFICATION NUMBER recorded in Block 16 represents the person who ensured that Section A was completed in its entirety and signed by the customer, who reviewed the identification and residency documentation, and completed Section B in accordance with procedures set forth by the Virginia State Police, including:
