INSTRUCTIONS

The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) has the authority to grant variances to design, construction, operation or maintenance requirements of the Water Reclamation and Reuse Regulation (9VAC25-740-10 et seq.) for projects involving the production, distribution or reuse of reclaimed water that are not otherwise excluded from the requirements of the regulation per 9VAC25-740-50. Any person or entity applying for a variance must demonstrate that:

- Complying with such requirements would be contrary to the purpose of State Water Control Law, specifically § <u>62.1-44.2</u> of the Code of Virginia,
- The hardship imposed by such requirements, which may be economic, outweighs the benefits of the project, and
- The granting of such variance would not adversely impact public health or the environment.

Where the Water Reclamation and Reuse Regulation references the Sewage Collection and Treatment Regulations (<u>9VAC25-790-10 et seq.</u>) for design, construction, operation, or maintenance requirements affecting components of a project to produce, distribute, or reuse reclaimed water, an application for a variance to such requirements shall be in accordance with variance procedures described in <u>9VAC25-790-10 et seq.</u>

WHO MAY APPLY FOR A VARIANCE

Any person or entity wishing to initiate a project for the production, distribution or reuse of reclaimed water that is not excluded from the requirements of the Water Reclamation and Reuse Regulation per <u>9VAC25-740-50</u>, may apply for a variance to design, construction, operation, or maintenance requirements of the regulation. A variance application may be submitted for only projects applying for or holding a valid VPDES permit, VPA permit, administrative authorization associated with an existing VPDES permit, or emergency authorization associated with an existing VPDES or VPA permit to produce, distribute or reuse reclaimed water.

WHERE TO FILE A VARIANCE APPLICATION

The completed variance application must be submitted to the DEQ Regional Office covering the area where the project will be located. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

The following are instructions specific to Sections A, B, C, D and E of the application.

A. Applicant Information

Section A must be completed to provide information about the applicant and the project for which the variance application is being submitted. The applicant will, in most cases, be the owner of the project, and the same person or party applying for or holding a valid VPDES permit, VPA permit, administrative authorization associated with an existing VPDES permit, or emergency authorization associated with an existing VPDES or VPA permit to produce, distribute or reuse reclaimed water. Project information must include the name, and physical address and location of the project.

B. Permitting Information

Section B must be completed to determine (i) the eligibility of the project for a variance, (ii) the need to be submit the <u>Water Reclamation and Reuse Addendum to an Application for Virginia Pollutant Discharge</u> <u>Elimination System Permit or a Virginia Pollution Abatement Permit</u> with the variance application, and (iii) any existing permit coverage of the project related to water reclamation and reuse. Note that a variance application may be submitted for only projects applying for or holding a valid VPDES permit, VPA permit, administrative authorization associated with an existing VPDES permit, or emergency authorization associated with an existing VPDES or VPA permit to produce, distribute or reuse reclaimed water.

C. Variance Information

Section C must be completed to provide information on the variance being requested for the project. This information will be evaluated by DEQ in a decision to grant or deny the requested variance, and should be clear, relevant and detailed. If needed to complete items C.1 through C.6 of the application, additional information may be attached. See "General" above for more instructions regarding application attachments.

D. Consent to Receive and Certify Receipt of Electronic Mail
